





Looking forward to Summer in the Cemetery



Coming in June - Weekend Working

The first weekend working parties at the cemetery will be held on June 17th & 18th.

This will be to start the process of **documenting** the section of the cemetery that we have cleared—transcribing inscriptions, photographing and mapping.

Don't be put off if you can't make the whole session—please feel free to pop along and give the time you can spare.

We may also be clearing more graves if people would like to do this.



Wildlife in the Cemetery

We have been approached by the **council to do a wildlife study** of the cemetery area. This will be incorporated in our efforts to promote a diverse wildlife eco-system at the cemetery.

We are currently in negotiation with **the council** to be able to put up bird feeders and also bird and bat nest boxes. If we are successful we would be asking members to help by providing bird food.

We will be trialling an area of **wildlife meadow** to see if this is viable as a future project. This will be carried out in the area of the consecrated paupers' graves.



Down Cemetery Heritage

We are hoping to be able to offer **guided walks** of the cemetery on 9th September as part of Trowbridge Heritage Open Days.

We made a start on the research in **February at the History Centre** and were delighted by the breadth and depth of information in the Down Cemetery Committee archives.
